*Just Duet*

Phil deGruy is one of those guys that truly occupy their own unique space within the guitarcraft continuum. For starters, he plays the *Guitarp*, an instrument custom-built by Bay Area super-luthier Ralph Novak that's basically a fanned-fret 7-string guitar with ten additional strings tuned to the upper register of a harp. And the extra strings aren't just ornamental or "sympathetic" strings—he plays them like a harpist would, fingerpicking chords, melodies, and even pinching-off harmonics. Joining deGruy on the disc of duets are a cast of stellar players, including Larry Coryell, Tronzo, Mike Stern, Reeves Gabrels, Charlie Hunter, Steve Masakowski, and Hank Mackie. Despite the big guns, however, this is clearly deGruy's show, and he more than holds his own throughout. An astonishing
